Year 6 - Walking to and from School Unattended

There is no set age when children are ready to walk to school or home on their own. It very much depends upon their maturity and confidence. Therefore, as regards to pupils in Year 6, we believe that you as parents need to decide whether your child is ready for this responsibility in Term 6. In deciding whether your child is ready to walk to school you should assess any risks associated with the route and your child's confidence. Work with your child to build up their independence while walking to school through route finding, road safety skills and general awareness.

When deciding whether your child is ready for this responsibility you might want to consider the following:

- Do you trust them to walk straight home?
- Do you trust them to behave sensibly when with a friend?
- Are they road safety aware?
- Would they know what to do if a stranger approaches them?
- Would they have the confidence to refuse to do what a stranger asked?
- Would they know what to do if they needed help?
- Would they know who best to approach to get help?

Please teach your child to:

- Pay attention to traffic at all times when crossing the street; never become distracted.
- Always cross at the intersection where there are traffic lights; do not cross in the middle of the road.
 Alternatively cross in a place where you can see clearly in all directions. Avoid parked cars or bends in the road.
- Look both ways before crossing; listen for traffic coming; cross while keeping an eye on traffic.
- Look out for cyclists.
- Remember that drivers may not see them, even if they can see the driver.
- Remember that it is hard to judge the speed of a car so be cautious.

Should their behaviour not be acceptable you will be asked to accompany or collect them until they have proved they can be trusted again. If you are not confident about how your child would react then you should consider whether you should allow them to walk on their own.

If you decide that your child is ready for this responsibility starting Monday 3rd June, then you must inform the school by completing the 'Walking to/from School Agreement' which needs to be returned to the school office before the first day of walking. Your child will be prevented from walking home unless this permission has been given in writing.
